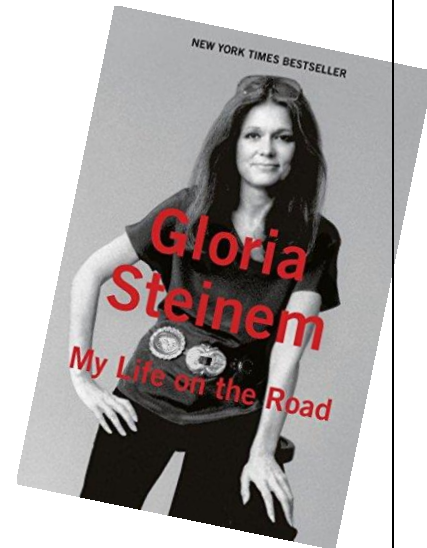

***My Life on the Road* by Gloria Steinem**

My Life on the Road is a traveler's journey like no other, and Gloria Steinem, feminist icon, 2013 Presidential Medal of Freedom recipient (President Obama called her a "champion notice-er"), journalist, organizer and activist, is your unique guide. Leading us on her road trips as a child and later as an activist and organizer, Steinem attaches faces and stories to the many reasons she loves and learns from it all. At 81, she is still at it.



What makes Steinem such a credible activist and organizer for human rights is her ability to listen to and learn from others. For example, she learns from Native Americans that Ben Franklin used the Iroquois Confederacy as a model for the U.S. Constitution (except the Founding Fathers left out women). She asks, what else didn't we learn in school?

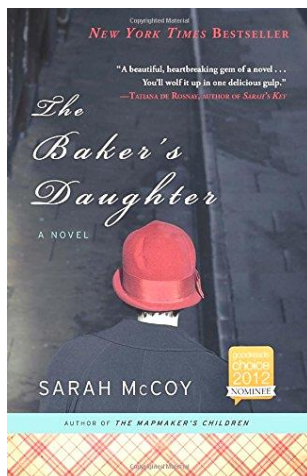

***The Baker's Daughter* by Sarah McCoy**

from Book Browse...A routine interview between a reporter and an elderly baker brings out memories of darker times: her life in Germany during that last bleak year of WWII. As their lives become more intertwined, all are forced to confront the uncomfortable truths of the past and seek out the courage to forgive.

In 1945, Elsie Schmidt is a naive teenager, as eager for her first sip of champagne as she is for her first kiss. She and her family have been protected from the worst of the terror and desperation overtaking her country by a high-ranking Nazi who wishes to marry her. So when an escaped Jewish boy arrives on Elsie's doorstep in the dead of night on Christmas Eve, Elsie understands that opening the door would put all she loves in danger.



Sixty years later, in El Paso, Texas, Reba Adams is trying to file a feel-good Christmas piece for the local magazine. Reba is perpetually on the run from memories of a turbulent childhood, but she's been in El Paso long enough to get a full-time job and a fiancé, Riki Chavez.

Reba's latest assignment has brought her to the shop of an elderly baker across town. The interview should take a few hours at most, but the owner of Elsie's German Bakery is no easy subject. Reba finds herself returning to the bakery again and again, anxious to find the heart of the story. For Elsie, Reba's questions are a stinging reminder of darker times: her life in Germany during that last bleak year of WWII. And as Elsie, Reba, and Riki's lives become more intertwined, all are forced to confront the uncomfortable truths of the past and seek out the courage to forgive.

Who knew that in 1964 AAUW would be just the organization to welcome and nurture a young wife, mother and educator! **Vonnie Solomonson** had resided in Wausau two years when her neighbor, Barbara Sorenson, invited her to an AAUW meeting. Vonnie remembers the camaraderie of this large group (close to 80 members then) where young wives raising families were encouraged and mentored by the respected, successful career women who attended afternoon study groups and worked on community projects. Vonnie became Secretary in 1966 and has been active in AAUW ever since - in addition to a full schedule including teaching, being a Congressional Aide, volunteering at Immanuel Lutheran Church and with Sons of Norway (not to mention travelling internationally with her husband Allan). AAUW's policy on education of women and encouraging advanced degrees kept Vonnie focused. 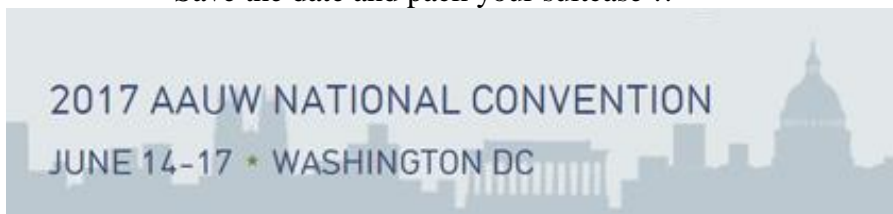
