

Wisconsin's Early Care Funding System and Its Impact on Children and Families of Poverty

Thursday, September 21st at 4:00 P.M. at UWMC Terrace Room



Because there is so much interest in education in AAUW and society, our program will feature a double-header with two AAUW Wausau Branch members. Julie Burmesch has expertise in early childhood development and education. She will address current issues that affect families and schools in this critical stage of a young learner. Mary Jarvis will share her research about the effects of the current budget on the early childhood educational system including the impact of private school vouchers

The *Wisconsin Shares* program is supposed to make quality childcare more affordable for families but instead low reimbursement rates prevent low wage workers from accessing the funds putting our most vulnerable children in high risk environments.

Julie Burmesch worked as principal of A.C. Kiefer School in Wausau and became the Coordinator of Pre-Kindergarten and Early Childhood Special Education Programs for the Wausau School District. She implemented the charter for the Starbright Charter School for at-risk 4 year olds and expanded it to the current 4K program serving all 4 year olds in Wausau. She is an early brain development trainer, parent educator and has presented and consulted on early childhood issues throughout Wisconsin, Florida and Illinois. She is recently retired. Currently she is the Chair of the Education Subcommittee of the Marathon County Life Report and past chair of the Marathon County Early Years Coalition. She has received multiple recognitions and awards for teaching and child advocacy including the Marathon County United Way Advocate of the Year, 2014

Mary Jarvis graduated from the University of Wisconsin, Stout in 1973 with a BA in Psychology, later obtaining a Master's in Education and certification in Counseling. She has retired from the Wausau Public Schools with 35 years of teaching Psychology.

Mary has always believed that equality, fairness and quality schools build strong communities. She maintains her advocacy for equity in education as a member of American Association of University Women (AAUW) and Wisconsin Education Association Council (WEAC). Mary continues to play a role in informing voters of candidates that support quality public education, a key ingredient in preserving an informed democracy.


